Preventing drowning in Asia – how Australians can make a difference – Justin Scarr, RLSSA
Emerging research shows that drowning is the leading killer of children in many countries in Asia. Royal Life Saving, with partners The Alliance for Safe Children, has been testing large scale population based interventions in Bangladesh, Vietnam and Thailand. AUSTSWIM too has been called to respond to the challenge through supporting individual programs and assisting by establishing training programs in several countries in Asia. This presentation will challenge many assumptions and understandings about the realities of preventing drowning in Asia. It will share insights generated by the Australian Government supported International Drowning Research Centre in Bangladesh and in organising the World Conference on Drowning Prevention 2011 in Vietnam. The presentation will outline a collaborative roadmap for Australian community and industry involvement in building sustainable strategies to reduce this child drowning burden on communities and governments in our region.

For anyone teaching infants, this information can assist your education of parents and where their child's motor development is at. Learn what the motor development stages are and how they transfer into the aquatic environment.

We all know sculling is an important part of swimming, however do we really know just how important sculling is and how it can change the way we teach many aspects of our program? Dry: Programming for Difference – Jean Kemp (VIC)

There are many things we can change to make our programs different and relevant to the needs of our own swimmers and environments. These differences can be in the age, ability, mobility, ability to learn, mild and more 'common' disabilities, etc. Programming is important when coping with differences and can be a challenge for teachers. We can all succeed – teacher and swimmer!


Dry: Style vs Technique – Prioritising Corrections – Carolyn Veldhuyzen (SA)

Correcting stroke faults can often be a domino effect to efficient technique, prioritizing where the domino starts can affect the remainder of the stroke. Start at the wrong place and none of the dominoes fall but more are added to the list, find the primary fault and work backwards to achieve great technique. We also need to understand what is individual style but technically efficient. This session is designed to help the teacher identify and correct stroke faults.

Dry: Marketing your Swim School – Les Mole (QLD)

Swim school operators are no different to any other modern day businesses, wrestling with the seamless ways that you seek to advertise and promote your day to day operations. This session will investigate a number of avenues that you can easily adopt to market your business, and get the most for your advertising budget. Les has been involved in the aquatics industry over a number of decades and will share his experiences in marketing and promotion.

Wet: Teaching Adults with Varying Abilities – Ranay Kennerley (NSW)

 When teaching an adult lesson you will encounter many pre-existing injuries and health conditions. It is often due to the adult's inability to participate in weight bearing activities that directs them to the aquatic environment. This session will demonstrate a lesson a range of sample lessons for mixed abilities and how to manage the varying health conditions of adults to achieve their specific swimming goals.

Dry: The A to Z of Assessment for People with Disabilities – Bradley Low (QLD)

Teaching people with disabilities can be a challenging but rewarding experience. Critical to the success of any PWD swimming education program is the development and implementation of a successful assessment tool. This session will provide you with guidelines about what you should include in an assessment, present you with an assessment model and give you the tools to develop your own assessment tool.


Dry: Infant and Toddlers – Maria Burn (VIC)

This session addresses the assessment tool that measures YOU – the teacher! Maria will highlight the qualities required to ensure the progress of the infant whilst allowing teachers to reflect on the impact of their delivery. So often we focus on what we need to improve but this session demonstrates that understanding areas of strength can correct areas of weakness and help all teachers improve their craft.

Dry: RLSS Swim and Survive – Mark Frazer, RLSS (QLD)

To maintain Swim and Survive as the leading aquatic education program, it has recently undergone an extensive review process where the development included the re-branding, the improvement of skill competencies, linking the award structure to promote a progression of learning throughout a child's key life stages, and the support of quality resources to help the implementation of the program. This session will provide you and overview of the new program and answer all your questions.

Wet: Fun Fin Friday – Janelle O'Neill (QLD)

 Look forward to an explosion of skills with a twist. Is the 'black line' wearing you or the swimmers down? Even in an aquatic environment, children need stimulus and motivation. Many motivating techniques are shown with emphasis on basic skills for strokes. Creativity and equipment infusion are the essential ingredients to ensure that both stroke development and maintenance are encouraged in a stimulating environment.

Ben Austin has been compared with Ian Thorpe after winning a total of nine Paralympic medals throughout his swimming career. He is now one of Australia's most recognized and successful swimmers of all time. Three time Para Olympian, World record holder, team captain of the Athens and Beijing Games, and a medal tally that inspires the likes of Grant Hackett and all of the Australian team. After a brief interlude where Ben contemplated his swimming future he decided to return to the pool in March 2010 and was successful in gaining places on the Australian Commonwealth games team and Australian World Cup Team where he will compete later in the year.

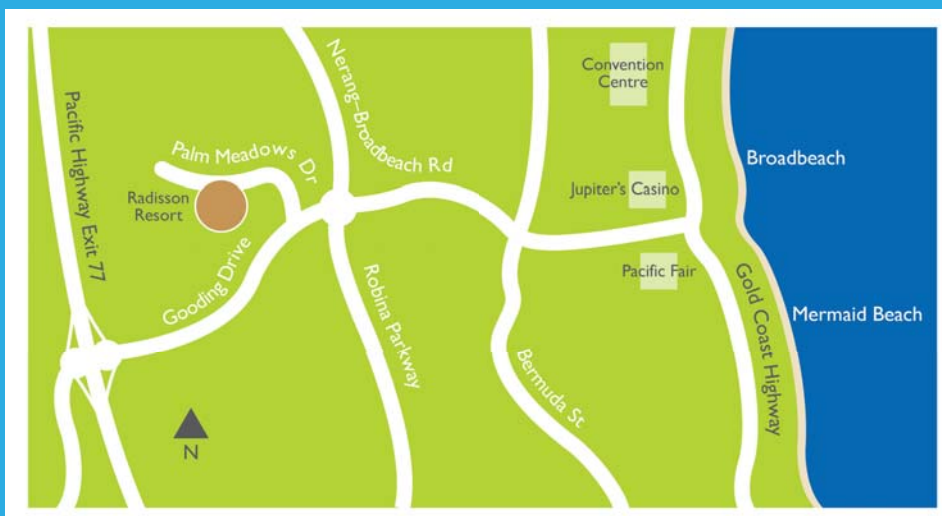
